Executive Summary

District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the eighth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

Wetherbee ES serves 947 students enrolled in grades Kindergarten through fifth. The student population's ethnicity is made of 59% Hispanic and 41% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 68% White, 17% Black, 1% Native, 13% Asian, 1% Pacific, and 0% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Jackie Hamann and Assistant Principal Christine Pares. Wetherbee ES is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include Battle of the Books, Spanish, and Music Club. As well as patrols, gifted program and news crew.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Wetherbee ES indicates that the average age of the collection is 2011 and the number of books per student is 9. The <u>American Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for highly effective media centers that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection.

At this time, Wetherbee ES does not meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- Students in this school improved on the state achievement test.
- Fifth grade science improved 8% last year
- In addition to the physical media center collection, the district provides almost 5,000 eBooks, audiobooks and digital magazines.
- Many of our students read in their native language as well as emerging second language readers. This is a need in our collection.
- Hispanic students are 56% of the school's population. However, we only have 200 titles written in Spanish and only 15% of the characters or biographies feature Hispanic people.
- Purchases of new books will focus on Hispanic students and Hispanic heritage.

Comparison between 2021-22 and 2022-23 Testing Data

(adapted from https://www.fldoe.org/accountability/assessments/k-12-student-assessment/results/2023.stml) In 2023, the state transitioned from Florida Standards Assessments (FSA) to Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. The 2022-23 for FAST and Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) End-of-Course (EOC) assessments are based on **provisional** achievement level cuts that are linked to each assessment's respective 2021-22 reporting scale. Comparisons should not be made between the 2023 data and previous years' data. The implementation of FAST K-2 in the 2022-23 school year was the first administration of statewide assessments for students in grades K-2. These assessments include Star Early Literacy Proficiency, Star Reading Proficiency, and Star Math Proficiency.

Collection Analysis

The collection is developed for and influenced by students, their interests, academic needs and alignment to the curriculum. The data below is a snapshot of the collection based on a Titlewise Analysis from July 2023. Purchasing or weeding after that time is not reflected in this data.

Notes

- Overall the aged books in my collection have improved from last year however they still need to be weeded and new books purchased.
- The Easy book collections average age is 2008 however it improved 2 years from last year's data.
- Language books consist of 67 titles with a 2008 average age. Once the titles are weeded, new items need to be purchased.
- Literature titles consist of 199 titles with a 2007 average age. This average falls below the district recommendation of 2008. Books need to be weeded.
- The Easy book collection has an average age of 2008 but many of these old books have a high check out rate.

•	Our average reading level is a 3.6 and our items in collection on this level are 1,622. The means 19.3% of our collection is within the reading range of 3.0-3.9.	nis
